Why Trump Cannot Be the Antichrist

Please put politics aside. Those who are political on the Democratic side will be upset with this article for not pinning the title of antichrist upon President Donald Trump. Those on the Republican side will be upset because the facts of Trump's activities will be brought out, which are not all good. So, again, put politics aside. It has no place in religion.

Joking or not, President Trump has shown some confusing signs that have antichrist tendencies. The picture of Trump as the next pope and the image of appearing as Jesus but instead of Jesus it is Trump healing people and even being prayed to, are two aspects of the acting in place of Christ. The fixation of the ballroom, the arch, and even putting his name on The Kennedy Center shows that he is not far from erecting an image to be worshipped. Invading Venezuela, wanting to annex Canada or a province of Canada as the 51st state, declaring that he could take Cuba, wanting to take Greenland either by purchase or force, and actually invading Iran, all show war like tendencies, a trademark of the antichrist. These

are, on a certain level, the characteristics of Revelation 13 referring to the first beast, which many Christians believe represents the antichrist.

Even Republican voices are bringing such thoughts into question. We have Marjorie Taylor Greene, Tucker Carlson, Clint Russel, Alex Jones, Rod Dreher, Kirk Cameron, and others.

But no person throwing the name "antichrist" at President Trump nor his activities make it so. It is what the Bible details that makes it so. And the interesting thing about the Bible and the description of the antichrist is that all points have to apply or that person is not the antichrist. A person cannot fulfill five points and ignore the other eighty points.

So, here is a list of reasons why President Donald Trump is not the antichrist in which this is but a few of the many possible reasons.

1. In Revelation 13:1, John states that he "saw a beast rise up out of the sea". With "Jesus Christ the same yesterday, and to day, and for ever" (Hebrews 13:8), that means symbolism is consistent throughout the

Bible. In Daniel 7:23, we are told that "The fourth beast shall be the fourth kingdom upon earth" referring to the prophecy of beasts in Daniel 7, but the point is, the Bible declares beasts to represent kingdoms or nations. And President Donald Trump is not a nation. He may represent a nation, but he himself is not a nation. Antichrist is a nation that may be led by a man, but the man himself is not the antichrist. The nation itself is the antichrist.

2. In Revelation 13:3, it states that John "saw one of his heads as it were wounded to death". A bullet to the ear is not the same as a deadly head wound. This is describing that the nation would cease in having power, but "his deadly wound was healed: and all the world wondered after the beast", therefore we ought to look for a nation that ceased momentarily to exist as a nation, but is coming back to life, being the antichrist. And no, the nation of Israel does not count, as we shall see it does not fit the location.

3. According to Revelation 13:5, the antichrist would have “a mouth speaking great things and blasphemies”. Though President Donald Trump does have a tendency to speak great things and become a bit blasphemous at times, one of two main definitions of blasphemy is found in Mark 2:7, which he does not fulfill. It says, “Why doth this [man] thus speak blasphemies? who can forgive sins but God only?” Now, President Donald Trump may extend his office powers further than he ought, but he has not declared the ability to forgive sins.

4. In Revelation 13:18, it says, “Here is wisdom. Let him that hath understanding count the number of the beast: for it is the number of a man; and his number [is] Six hundred threescore [and] six”. President Donald Trump’s name, or even the title, does not add up to 666. In fact, no American’s name adds up to 666. The reason is that the world making Roman numerals the standard to figure out what names add up to 666 is not biblical. The Bible did not say that it adds up to 666 in Roman numerals but simply it adds up to 666. What we have is that in every nation has an alphabet and a numerical system of which in some nations, they overlap, where numbers are also letters and the other way around. Here, in America, they do not overlap. They are distinctly separate. In other languages, a number of countries do have them overlap, especially the Roman numerals and alphabet.

Obviously, the Roman or Latin system does overlap, but there are other countries that merge the two together as well, which includes Greek, Hebrew, and Arabic. And in those countries, using their respective alphabet and numerical systems where they overlap, the antichrist would have a name or a title that adds up to 666. So, President Donald Trump and all Americans are safe on this one.

5. Next, we know President Donald Trump is getting a bit old, but he is not as old as two writers claim him to have to be. John states, “Little children, it is the last time: and as ye have heard that antichrist shall come, even now are there many antichrists; whereby we know that it is the last time. They went out from us, but they were not of us; for if they had been of us, they would [no doubt] have continued with us: but [they went out], that they might be made manifest that they were not all of us.” Paul tells us, “For the mystery of iniquity doth already work: only he who now letteth [will let], until he be taken out of the way” (2 Thessalonians 2:7). That is nearly two thousand years ago. President Donald Trump is not nearly that old.

6. Now, according to John in his epistles, there is a primary activity of the antichrist that President Donald Trump does not attempt to practice. “I have not written unto you because ye know not the truth, but because ye know it, and that no lie is of the truth. Who is a liar but he that denieth that Jesus is the Christ? He is antichrist, that

denieth the Father and the Son” (1 John 2:21-22). “And every spirit that confesseth not that Jesus Christ is come in the flesh is not of God: and this is that [spirit] of antichrist, whereof ye have heard that it should come; and even now already is it in the world. Ye are of God, little children, and have overcome them: because greater is he that is in you, than he that is in the world. They are of the world: therefore speak they of the world, and the world heareth them. We are of God: he that knoweth God heareth us; he that is not of God heareth not us. Hereby know we the spirit of truth, and the spirit of error” (1 John 4:3-6). “For many deceivers are entered into the world, who confess not that Jesus Christ is come in the flesh. This is a deceiver and an antichrist. Look to yourselves, that we lose not those things which we have wrought, but that we receive a full reward. Whosoever transgresseth, and abideth not in the doctrine of Christ, hath not God. He that abideth in the doctrine of Christ, he hath both the Father and the Son” (2 John 1:7-9). The issue is over changing God’s truth into a lie, changing God’s truth into error, and causing people to cease following the doctrines of Jesus Christ to follow other doctrines. Overall, that does not seem to be a political activity, but a religious one instead.

7. In working from the fact that John heard the term “antichrist” before, we

searched the scriptures of where John could have heard this. Jesus warned of false Christs but that is different from being an antichrist. A false Christ is a person pretending to be Christ himself, and there are plenty of them walking around the world today professing to be Jesus Christ. An antichrist works against Christ, especially against God's truth and His doctrines, as we already revealed. So, where did John hear of antichrist? From Daniel, is the answer. "He shall also stand up against the Prince of princes" (Daniel 8:25). That is a reference to Jesus Christ of which Daniel did not have a name yet, for at the time of his writing, Jesus did not already walk the earth in human form. This is no different than Jesus being called "KING OF KINGS, AND LORD OF LORDS" (Revelation 19:16 and 1 Timothy 6:15). Isaiah 9:6 declares, "For unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given: and the government shall be upon his shoulder: and his name shall be called Wonderful, Counsellor, The mighty God, The everlasting Father, The Prince of Peace." So, with Daniel seeing the antichrist power arise, more

detail is given of this power in Daniel 7, in which he sees, not by chance, the same body parts of the conglomerate beast of Revelation 13, as John revealed only they are whole animals instead of body parts. "And four great beasts came up from the sea, diverse one from another. The first [was] like a lion, and had eagle's wings: I beheld till the wings thereof were plucked, and it was lifted up from the earth, and made stand upon the feet as a man, and a man's heart was given to it. And behold another beast, a second, like to a bear, and it raised up itself on one side, and [it had] three ribs in the mouth of it between the teeth of it: and they said thus unto it, Arise, devour much flesh. After this I beheld, and lo another, like a leopard, which had upon the back of it four wings of a fowl; the beast had also four heads; and dominion was given to it. After this I saw in the night visions, and behold a fourth beast, dreadful and terrible, and strong exceedingly; and it had great iron teeth: it devoured and brake in pieces, and stamped the residue with the feet of it: and it [was] diverse from all the beasts that [were] before it;

and it had ten horns" (Daniel 7:3-7). As mentioned earlier, these beasts represent kingdoms in which Daniel 2 matches the number of beasts with metal parts, telling us the starting point. In other words, Daniel's lion of Daniel 7 matches the golden head of Daniel 2 pointing to the kingdom of Babylon (Daniel 2:38). The bear of Daniel 7 matching the silver chest and arms of Daniel 2 represents Medes and Persians (Daniel 5:28). The leopard of Daniel 7 and thighs of brass of Daniel 2 match that of Greece (Daniel 8:21). The iron teeth creature of Daniel 7 and iron legs of the statue in Daniel 2 is none other than Rome, if you are following the rise and fall of Empires thus far. Finally, we have the division of ten horns in Daniel 7 matching the ten toes of Daniel 2, which is better known as Europe. Now, our point is that Daniel states, "I considered the horns, and, behold, there came up among them another little horn, before whom there were three of the first horns plucked up by the roots: and, behold, in this horn [were] eyes like the eyes of man, and a mouth speaking great things" (Daniel 7:8). The little horn power,

better known as the antichrist, arises in Europe and not the United States. And here is the item that very much eliminates President Donald Trump from being the antichrist. It is a European nation that is the antichrist and not an American one.

8. And as an added bonus, let us look at one of the activities of the antichrist according to Daniel. In Daniel 7:25, "he shall speak [great] words against the most High, and shall wear out the saints of the most High, and think to change times and laws: and they shall be given into his hand until a time and times and the dividing of time." The focus is upon thinking to change times and laws. Those are not just any laws. God does not care if tax laws change, nor the speed limit, or any other man-made law. We are talking about God's law, and times would appear to be changed here on earth but not recognized by Heaven. The last we checked, President Donald Trump has not attempted to change God's Ten Commandments, specifically, the one dealing with time,

which is the one stating "Remember the sabbath day, to keep it holy. Six days shalt thou labour, and do all thy work: But the seventh day [is] the sabbath of the LORD thy God: [in it] thou shalt not do any work, thou, nor thy son, nor thy daughter, thy manservant, nor thy maidservant, nor thy cattle, nor thy stranger that [is] within thy gates: For [in] six days the LORD made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that in them [is], and rested the seventh day: wherefore the LORD blessed the sabbath day, and hallowed it" (Exodus 20:8-11). Since Daniel sees that at least two "times" have changed, since it is plural, the other change comes in with the start of each day. "The evening and the morning were the first day" (Genesis 1:5, 8, 13, 19, 23, 31). And then God said, "Let there be lights in the firmament of the heaven to divide the day from the night; and let them be for signs, and for seasons, and for days, and years" (Genesis 1:14). The lights in the firmament includes the sun. It is to be used for telling of the days. Midnight is a man-made time. Sunsets are God's times.

In other words, antichrist would change the day of the Sabbath as well as when it begins and ends. Instead of beginning at sunset and ending at the next sunset, a midnight to midnight schedule would be adopted.

So, there we have at least eight reasons why President Donald Trump cannot be the antichrist, but hopefully you are thinking seriously about looking over in Europe at a country that declares the ability to absolve sins, messes with the doctrines of Jesus Christ, changed the Sabbath, adopted a midnight to midnight schedule for tracking days, ceased to have existed for a period of time and then reemerge in a healing process, has its roots in apostolic times, and has a title that is applied to the head of the nation that when translated into other languages that use a joint alphabet and numerical system, adds up to 666.

May God provide the eyesight to see, and the courage to believe, we are not to hate those that are deceived, but, with sympathy, call them out from the false teachings, even unbiblical teachings.

Why Esau Could Not Repent

In Scripture Esau is called a “profane person” (Hebrews 12:16), which simply means, irreverent to anything sacred. He represents those who lightly value the redemption Christ purchased for them and are ready to sacrifice their heavenly inheritance for the perishable things of earth. Multitudes today are living with no thought or care for the future. Like Esau they cry, “Let us eat and drink, for tomorrow we die” (1 Corinthians 15:32). The desires of worldly appetite prevail, not just for food, and God and heaven are virtually despised. When they are presented with the duty of cleansing themselves from all filthiness of the flesh and spirit, perfecting holiness in the fear of God, they are offended.

Living for the day, every day, multitudes all around us are selling their birthright to indulge their senses. They sacrifice health, weaken their mental abilities, and forfeit heaven, all for temporary pleasure that both weakens and debases them. Esau awoke too late to recover his loss. In the day of judgment, it will be the same with those who have traded their status as heirs of heaven for their own selfish gratifications.

Esau was not shut out from seeking God’s favor by repentance, but he could find no way to recover the birthright. His grief did not spring from conviction of sin; he did not desire to be reconciled to God. He was

sorrowful because of the results of his sin, but not for the sin itself.

So, the birthright that he had so carelessly bargained away, he could not regain. Esau sold his inheritance “For one morsel of food”, for a momentary gratification of his appetite that had never been restrained. That “morsel of food” can be any little or large, thing in our life that we favour over our relationship with God. It might not be a physical object; it could be a personal characteristic of our own that we secretly cherish, such as demanding our own way, which like Esau's appetite, had never been restrained or corrected, never been surrendered to God.

Esau had lightly valued the blessing when it seemed within his reach, but now that it was gone from him his grief and rage were terrible. “Bless me—me also, O my father! ... Have you not reserved a blessing for me?” When he saw his folly, it was too late to recover the blessing. No amount of pleading, crying or prayer could change his outcome. He had invested everything within his whole being to having his own way. “He found no place for repentance, though he sought it diligently with tears” (Hebrews 12:17). God would surely relent and take him back if there were just enough tears shed or prayers sent up. Or so he thought.

But this was a perfect example of “sin unto death”; a harsh Biblical reality that most do not want to

even acknowledge which refers to a serious or willful sin that leads to spiritual death and separation from God, as mentioned in 1 John 5:16,17.

One interpretation is that the “sin unto death” refers to a sin so grievous that God chooses to bring immediate physical judgment upon the person. There are biblical examples where individuals faced divine punishment for their sins:

Ananias and Sapphira in Acts 5:1-11, where they lied to the Holy Spirit about the proceeds of a land sale and were struck dead immediately.

Nahab and Abihu in Leviticus 10:1-2, where they offered profane fire before the Lord and were consumed by fire.

Korah and His Followers in Numbers 16:31-35 recounting how Korah's rebellion against Moses led to the ground swallowing him and his followers.

Some in the Corinthian Church, according to I Corinthians 11:29-30, where Paul states that some believers had fallen sick and died because they partook of the Lord’s Supper in an unworthy manner.

These examples suggest that in certain cases, persistent rebellion and grievous sin against God can result in divine judgment through physical death.

Another interpretation of the “sin unto death” aligns it with the

unpardonable sin, which is blasphemy against the Holy Spirit. Jesus warns in Mark 3:28-29, "Verily I say unto you, All sins shall be forgiven unto the sons of men, and blasphemies wherewith soever they shall blaspheme: But he that shall blaspheme against the Holy Ghost hath never forgiveness, but is in danger of eternal damnation."

Blasphemy against the Holy Spirit is understood as a hardened rejection of God's work and a persistent state of unbelief. If a person continues in such rejection, they remain unforgiven, leading to eternal spiritual death.

The Bible warns against apostasy, which is the falling away from the faith after having received the knowledge of the truth. Hebrews 10:26 states, "For if we sin willfully after we have received the knowledge of the truth, there no longer remains a sacrifice for sins, but a certain fearful expectation of judgment, and fiery indignation which will devour the adversaries."

This suggests that someone who has known the truth, but deliberately turns away and persists in sin without repentance may be committing a "sin unto

death". Such a person hardens their heart to the point that they no longer respond to God's call to repentance.

Some view the "sin unto death" as any sin that a believer refuses to repent of, leading to a hardened heart and eventual spiritual ruin. Romans 6:23 says, "For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord."

If a person continually rejects correction and persists in sin without repentance, they risk falling away from God's grace and being spiritually dead.

There is another class of sins referred to as "sins *not* unto death" which includes such a multitudinous list we cannot number, but before thinking *Ah, there is relief!*, we must realize that when any sins on this list are allowed to go unconfessed and unrepented of they will fall into the category of the first list. Sins must not be allowed to accumulate on our record.

"All sin unrepented of and unconfessed, will remain upon the books of record. It will not be blotted out, it will not go beforehand to Judgment, to be

canceled by the atoning blood of Jesus. The accumulated sins of every individual will be written with absolute accuracy, and the penetrating light of God's law will try every secret of darkness. In proportion to the light, to the opportunities, and the knowledge of God's claims upon them, will be the condemnation of the rejecters of God's mercy". Jeremiah 8:16 tells us directly, "Therefore pray not thou for this people, neither lift up cry nor prayer for them, neither make intercession to me: for I will not hear thee."

Even the prayers of God's prophets are not to ascend for any who refuse to repent:

"Like other prophets of God, Jeremiah was a man of prayer, a man anxious to intercede in behalf of his people. Since the nation refused to reform, nothing could turn aside the doom that was coming. The chastisement and discipline must be allowed to do its work. Intercessory prayer to avert the threatened judgments would be unavailing".

So, let us do the heart good and repent of all of our known sins.

Garlic and Turmeric Rice

Ingredients:

- 10-12 cloves of garlic
- 1 small onion
- 160g broccolini
- 1 red bell pepper

- 3 tbsp avocado oil
- 1/4 cup corn

- Salt to taste

Directions:

1. Finely chop the garlic, onion, broccolini, and red bell pepper

4. Set the garlic and onions aside. Heat the pan to medium heat and add 1 tbsp of avocado oil

5. Sauté the broccolini and red bell pepper for a couple of minutes.
6. Add the corn, basmati rice, turmeric, salt, and the cooked garlic and onions.
7. Sauté for 2-3min

Broccolini was originally developed in the late 1980s as a hybrid of broccoli and kale, rather than as the product of genetic modification. It was developed to create a milder-tasting vegetable which could grow in hotter climates than broccoli.

Questions & Answers

Question: If a person is saved already, what is the purpose of being faithful?

Answer: According to a dictionary, "Faithful means being steadfast in loyalty, constantly adhering to promises, or strictly maintaining accuracy to an original standard." This simple definition agrees with your connection. If a person is already saved, what would be the consequence of being unfaithful to God? There would be none. So, all the verses of the Bible that states anything about faithfulness makes no sense to those that are "once saved, always saved".

Yet, the Bible says, "be thou faithful unto death, and I will give thee a crown of life" (Revelation 2:10). That means, according to the Bible, if we are unfaithful, then we do not receive the crown of life, which is eternal life, which means the person is lost, which means "once saved, always saved" is a lie. There is no way around that.

Revelation 17:14 states that Jesus "is Lord of lords, and King of kings: and they that are with him [are] called, and chosen, and faithful." So, if we, who are of Christ, would be faithful, not for a minute, an hour, a day, but every day, every hour, every minute, we are considered to be "with Him", and of the chosen. If we are not faithful, then we cannot be "with Him", and if we are not "with Him", we are lost, which means that, once again, "once saved, always saved" is a lie.

Try having a spouse tell the other spouse that they do not have to be faithful to one another since they already got married once, which

would be "once married, always married". Just see how long that marriage will last with not needing to be faithful to one another. Even the Bible commands faithfulness in this area: "Even so [must their] wives [be] grave, not slanderers, sober, faithful in all things" (1 Timothy 3:11).

Therefore, you have no disagreement from us.

Question: How do I get victory over sin? I keep failing.

Answer: "This is the victory that overcometh the world, [even] our faith" (1 John 5:4). Faith is the answer, but it is not the answer. Only true faith is the answer, but all it takes is just a small amount of doubt that cancels the faith. And when we see the evidence contrary to faith confirming the doubt, then it will spiral out of control.

So, how does one obtain that faith? "So then faith [cometh] by hearing, and hearing by the word of God" (Romans 10:17). Again, the Word of God is the solution, but it is not the only solution. Only a true understanding of the Word of God, and application thereof, is the solution. A simple reading of the Bible is not the solution. Ignoring a single verse that ought to be applied while even studying the Bible deeply (Isaiah 28:9-10) is not the solution. Only "rightly dividing the word of truth" (2 Timothy 2:15) is the true solution. Only accepting that "Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of God" (Matthew 4:4), which plainly

is stated as living by every Word of God, is the true solution.

Justifying one sin causes blindness. Working on one sin at a time is not going to work. So, "the axe is laid unto the root of the trees" (Matthew 3:10) and not pruning of fruit. Sin is the fruit of selfishness. Why do people sin? Primarily, it is a conscious decision to do so. That is why Jesus said, "If any [man] will come after me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow me" (Matthew 16:24).

Question: When we pray for something specific, like a job, are we supposed to keep praying for it, or pray once and trust God to answer? The Bible seems to say both ways are right. It says pray without ceasing, on the other hand, it says to put out a fleece and that is only once. Which is it?

Answer: The most direct answer is "Pray without ceasing" (1 Thessalonians 5:17). And in parable form, "I will avenge her, lest by her continual coming she weary me" (Luke 18:5).

So, it is not a once and done prayer. Until we get an answer, do not cease; besides, praying for the salvation of certain souls may take a lifetime.

Now in regards to the fleece, that was used in a test of answered prayer or command of God. That is not the same as praying for something to which no answer was given. Do keep in mind that we ought to balance the fleece test, though, with that of having faith. God was patient with Gideon, but

not with others who questioned God; to Zacharias for example, it was said, "Thou shalt be dumb, and not able to speak, until the day that these things shall be

performed, because thou believest not my words, which shall be fulfilled in their season" (Luke 1:20).

In better perspective, pray without ceasing for a job. If one is offered a job, then use the fleece type prayer to see if one should take it.
